

Speaker—Dr. Mark Hafen

"Sea Level Rise in Tampa Bay: Building Smart and Connected Communities"



Mark R. Hafen is Assistant Director and Master Instructor in the School of Public Affairs at the University of South Florida in Tampa, where he directs the Master of Urban & Regional Planning (MURP) program, with an emphasis on climate change adaptation, and urban environmental policy and planning. He holds a B.S. in Business Logistics from Penn State University, as well as an M.A. in Geography and a Ph.D. in Marine Science (Geology), both from USF. He has professional experience in land use planning, and has lived in the Tampa Bay region since 1986.

He and his team of USF faculty have been developing a game to help communities have a conversation about how to prioritize limited resources in the face of rising sea levels. TAS members helped them do one afternoon's test run on the game, and it has been presented at a national meeting. They're still refining the options.

Come hear how we and community leaders can play games now, so that they're not playing games when the waters come lapping at our doorsteps!


